

INTRODUCTION



This report has been drawn up with the aim of being included in the corporate social responsibility (CSR) reports of the sponsoring companies and academic collaborators.

All the information available in this document can be incorporated into the CSR reports of academic sponsors and collaborators.

Forma't al Port is a project that was born from a public-private collaboration between different entities with the aim of bringing the Port of Barcelona and its community closer to the students of higher degree training cycles of local colleges focusing logistics on transport, international trade and of university degrees focusing on logistics and maritime business, nautical and maritime transport, marine technologies and engineering in systems and naval technologies located in the port's area of influence.

It is within this framework that the Forma't all Port project should provide today's students - the professionals of the future - with knowledge supplied by current professionals of the logistics sector, as well as to familiarise themselves with maritime activities and intermodal transport.

The results obtained from the project will translate into a better technical preparation of the students, which will lead to an improvement in the employability index of the participants.

The training offered in this programme has a clear orientation towards the improvement of logistics chains, as well as their sustainability, through the dissemination of the European Union's policy regarding the transport of goods and the environment.

The Forma't al Port programme's annual report is oriented towards the Sustainable Development Objectives of the United Nations.

The 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) –the ambitious integral universal objectives– guide the implementation of the United Nations 2030 Agenda for sustainable development, approved on the 15th September 2015. The topics of the objectives range from poverty, hunger, peace, health, education, inequality, inclusion and economic prosperity, to the protection of the planet, the fight against climate change, cities and territories, energy, sustainable consumption and production, and governance.

This report identifies the objectives to which the programme contributes.




- To give students first-hand knowledge of the Port of Barcelona, its infrastructures, logistical equipment and operations, and to showcase the means of transport they operate.
- To give companies in the sector a space to introduce the characteristics of their activities and to introduce professional profiles they need in order to develop properly.
- To collaborate in the creation of a framework for dialogue and idea exchanges between companies in the logistics sector and training centres in order to promote the development of the sector.
- To contribute to the alignment of the training needs of companies with the curricula designed and taught in the training centres.
- To motivate companies to hire students in dual training programmes and / or internships, giving them the necessary support to welcome them in the best conditions.
- To provide students with the tools and knowledge necessary to quantify the environmental impact of transport operations, and to familiarise them with the European Union's policy on sustainable transport and logistics.
















TYPES OF COURSES

The Forma't al Port programme is divided into two sub-programmes aimed at vocational training in transport, logistics and international trade, and university degrees in logistics and maritime negotiations, nautical and maritime transport, marine technologies and engineering in naval systems and technology.

Forma't al Port – Introduction: 2-day course in Barcelona, where students discover the Port of Barcelona through an inland visit. The associations of the sector present the different professional profiles. This course is aimed at first year students.

Forma't al Port – Management: 4-day course on board of a Grandi Navi Veloci Ro-Pax vessel en route between Barcelona and Genoa. The course consists of lectures, visits to the vessel, a maritime visit to the Port of Barcelona and the Port of Genoa and the development of a case study. This course is aimed at the students who have already participated in the Introduction course. It is only offered with scholarships to students of vocational training centres.



Added value of the training

The documentation distributed during the training is in English in order to familiarise the students with this language. In addition, 30% of the classes are taught in English and students are motivated to make presentations in this foreign (to them) language.

All the activities of this training are presented from a critical perspective with the current focus of the environment. Students learn to calculate the environmental impact of logistical solutions and parallels to sustainable development goals are given throughout the training.

Thanks to the two-year programme, students have the opportunity to experience first-hand the operations that take place in the ports and on board of a vessel.





Participants

In 2020, Forma't al Port counted with the participation of 454 students from 16 public and private training centres (institutes and universities) in Barcelona, el Prat de Llobregat, Cerdanyola del Vallès, Mataró, Santa Perpètua de la Mogoda, Sant Adrià del Besòs and La Sènia.

All students participated in the Forma't al Port - Introduction training in person, which took place in January, February and March, and in a hybrid format (in person and online) during the months of October and November - a consequence of the 2020 global health crisis.


This year, the Forma't al Port - Management courses scheduled for October and November could not be held due to international travel limitations and restrictions on the number of people in in person and extracurricular training.

As for the gender distribution among the participants, 39% of female and 61% of male students participated in 2020. This shows that the programme gives future professionals the opportunity to get to know the port and port activities, as well as the intermodal transport sector, regardless of their gender.



Impact hours

The impact hours represent the hours dedicated to each student. In 2020, 5.902 hours were registered. This figure has decreased compared to the previous year, as the Management courses have not been carried out, which have a much higher amount of teaching hours than the Introduction courses. This type of course could not be carried out due to the Covid-19 pandemic


As for the Hybrid Introduction course, a new training modality has been created in which new materials have been developed to carry out virtual visits to the facilities, as well as various dynamic workshops to represent professional profiles. In addition, a face-to-face maritime visit has been incorporated. As such, it has been possible to keep the same number of lecture hours.



Quality

The Forma't al Port programme has a quality system (Course Quality Check) for all of its activities. All students complete an evaluation form of the activities at the end of each course. Materials, teachers, documentation, contents and time completion of the case study are evaluated. The report drawn up on the basis of the surveys is subsequently analysed by the Academic and Executive Committees respectively, with the aim of seeking improvements in future editions.

In the activities carried out during the year 2020 a qualification of 4 out of 5 has been obtained.

Internships and job bank

The Escola Europea offers a job and internship bank to the sponsors and collaborators, with the goal of disseminating job offers which might appeal to possible candidates. The Escola offers a first selection of candidates and this action contributes to the promotion of employability and fair job conditions to students and future professionals.

Internationalisation activities

Within the framework of the programme, the Escola Europea offers the centres the possibility to organise meetings with international centres that attend the Escola's training courses. In 2020, due to the travel limitations caused by Covid-19, it has not been possible to organise this type of meetings.

Dual Vocational Training promotion and teachers' internships

The organisers of the Forma't al Port programme have participated in the preparation of a conference called GETTING TALENT, in which companies in the sector are put in contact with teachers, with the aim of coordinating internships for teachers in companies.

Unfortunately, due to the pandemic, the event had to be cancelled two weeks before it was held.

The organisation of this event will be resumed when the sanitary conditions are adequate.






In person training (January - March)
