## TangerMED welcomes the first call of the Ane Maersk vessel, symbolizing decarbonization in maritime transport



The Ane Maersk, the first large container vessel powered by methanol and symbolizing the decarbonization of maritime transport, made its inaugural call at Tanger Med port complex on Wednesday, March 20, 2024.

Measuring 350 meters in length, this methanol-powered vessel marks the beginning of a series of eighteen large vessels to be delivered between 2024 and 2025 by Maersk.

This environmentally friendly vessel was greeted at Tanger MED port complex with a water salute, symbolizing the ongoing energy transition at sea.

The 16,592 TEU container ship originated from the port of Colombo and was headed towards Felixstowe, Hamburg, Antwerp, London, Le Havre, and then back to Asia.

#### Port of Luka Koper Hosts First Ship of the Season



During April we hosted the first cruise ship of 2024, the Spirit of Discovery of the Saga Cruises. At the same time this was her maiden call to Koper.

In 2024 we expect a total of 75 passenger vessels with 125.000 visitors, with last ship of the season scheduled for November.

#### Hydrogen Trains in the Port of La Spezia



La Spezia, Italy- Mercitalia Logistics and the Port of La Spezia have signed an agreement to use hydrogen as an alternative energy source as a fuel for railway shunting in port as well as in any other possible scop any other possible field of application.

In fact, the agreement was signed by Mario Sommariva, President of the Port System Authority of the Eastern Ligurian Sea, and Livio Ravera, CEO of Mercitalia Logistics, the company on which Mercitalia Shunting & Terminal, the company railway that operates the shunting service in the eastern Ligurian port.

#### Port of Valencia's Decarbonization Plan: Solar Energy



The solar panels of the Port of Valencia will generate 22% of the energy it consumes, in line with the port's decarbonisation plan

The Príncipe Felipe Quay facility is already operating at full capacity and supplies around



3.5% of the site's energy. The solar park being built on the VTE silo will contribute 18.5%.

Solar energy is one of the strategic pillars to turn the Port of Valencia into an emission-neutral area. Currently, the energy consumption of Valenciaport is equivalent to that of a city of about 120,000 inhabitants (around 90 gigawatts/year).


